



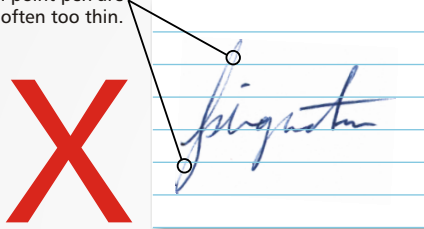

Submitting Your Signature

How to Create the Perfect *Signature* Stamp:

~ THE WRONG WAY ~

The strokes from a ball point pen are often too thin.



To ensure that your signature stamp is the best quality it can be there are a few things you **SHOULDN'T** do.

NO LINED PAPER: Signing on lined paper can cause distortions where the lines intersect your strokes.

NO BALL POINT: Using a ball point pen may cause certain areas of you signature to become too thin. When we make the stamp certain areas of your signature may disappear because of this.

~ THE RIGHT WAY ~



This signature was done using a gel pen on plain white paper.

The strokes were made carefully to ensure consistency.

You may also use a Sharpie or other felt pen and sign your name much larger than you need. We can reduce the size to whatever you require.

DON'T FAX IT!

~ E-MAIL IT ~

The example to the left shows what happens when a signature is faxed to us. The fax machine drastically reduces the resolution of the image causing a "jagged" or "pixilated" appearance.

The example to the left is a more ideal copy. This example was scanned and could be emailed. Your scanner will have a number of settings but the two that are important are:

Resolution - This should be set to a minimum of 300dpi

Scan Type - This should be set to color or grayscale
